The above dates are in accordance with the teachings of Mr Herbert W Armstrong, viz the Jewish calendar authorized by the Sanhedrin in 359CE is used to provide the start of a month, not the time of the conjunction of the New Moon. The inherent Jewish postponements of Holy Days, which Rabbis have inserted to move Holy Days to more convenient dates when the original dates would have clashed with Jewish customs, are accepted as divinely inspired. However Mr Armstrong rejected the Jewish teaching for determining Pentecost and used his own.

Jewish year 5789 is year 13 of the endlessly repeating 19 year Metonic cycle. Jewish year 5790 is year 14 of the endlessly repeating 19 year Metonic cycle.
